This hands-on workshop gives you the opportunity to learn about how *Clicker5* can be a great support for students with dyslexia and other learning disabilities.

**The morning session will explore Clicker5**, a powerful, yet easy to use writing support and multi-media tool which is ideal for early readers and writers and for older struggling readers and writers. This talking word processor lets students write with pictures and words by using on-screen grids giving students instant access to words, pictures, sounds and video clips. It supports learning across the curriculum and age groups. Resources can be adapted and individualised to suit the needs of any student.

**The afternoon session will look at Clicker Phonics and other Clicker5 resources** which can further support students in their literacy skills. Or, use this as extra time to work on becoming really familiar with using Clicker5.

If you have a laptop with Clicker5 already installed – please bring this along to the session. Otherwise, there are computers available for participants to work on.
